CCVT - EVENT
EATON LODGE – SUNDAY 1ST MAY 2011

This event was originally going to be set out by Steve Limb but he asked if he could swap and do Uppingham instead. We were therefore short of a clerk of course for Eaton so I offered to stand in if nobody else was available. Needless to say nobody was available. I usually like to put the canes in to make the sections the week before the event and then test them the day before to ensure they all drive satisfactorily prior to the event the following day. Unfortunately for me Andy had another club using the site over the Easter Holiday weekend so that put paid to that idea. Still, as the CCVT was part of the Chairman's Challenge being held over the Mayday weekend, the Friday, owing to the impending royal wedding was also designated as a Bank Holiday day off, so I would be able to make a start then. Brian had agreed to help out on the Friday so this made things much easier. The usual ten sections for this event were to be laid out, the last of which couldn't be pegged out until after Saturday's RTVT owing to using the same piece of ground. Brian and I set out seven sections prior to Andy joining us for the final two for Friday. These would be tweaked when testing on Saturday and adding the final tenth section after lunch.

There were nine entries on the Sunday, including two double entries, five in class 9 and four in class 10. Thanks to Andrew Birch and helpers for scrutineering.

Following marshals' and drivers' briefings the trial duly got under way promptly.

Section 1. A novel section which consisted of a single straight line of gates from start to five with a testing finish masterminded by Brian who had long wanted to try this out. This was a relatively easy first section with four clears, one 1, two 2's, one 3 and an uncharacteristic 8 from Stef.

Section 2. A more challenging section which saw a wide range of scores with only one clear from Donald.

Section 3. Gate ten was the curse of all but two, with Andy getting a one and Stef the single clear.

Section 4. This was a simple section for all but two, with seven clears and two fives.

Section 5. Gate ten once again caught out most with one eleven a six and a single clear from Donald.

Section 6. Another easier section this time with five clears.

Section 7. Gate seven proved the 'bogey fence' this time catching out seven competitors with a single ten and a two from Donald. (Seven definitely was not lucky on this occasion).

Section 8. Both Steve Limb and Donald went clear on this section with a mix of scores for the rest.

Section 9. Another mixture of scores here, once again only two going clear, this time from Steve Limb and Stef.

Section 10. The last section of the day were mainly either very good scores or very poor ones, with three clears, a single one, a two, a six, two tens and one eleven.

Overall, an enjoyable three days for me, despite the hard work, made easier with the help given and thanks to all concerned. I hope those that attended had an equally enjoyable event with fabulous weather despite the rather bitter wind. Congratulations to Donald finishing overall in first place on 19 penalties, the highest on 77 penalties. Thank all those who took part either as competitors, marshals, scrutineer etc.
